Year 4 are investigating the earth—types of rocks found in our area. We are looking at porous and non-porous rocks.

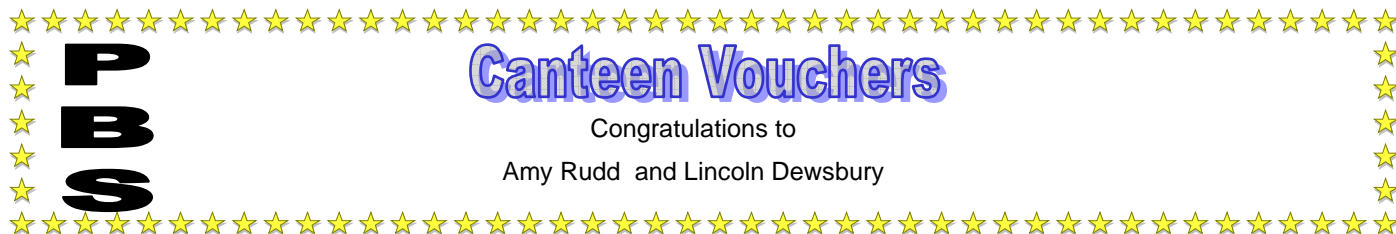
Miss Ballantine has been teaching chance and tessellating shapes. We will be continuing to skip count and how division relates to multiplication.

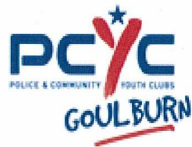
