### **Teach Your Child To Cook**

### **Apricot Drumsticks**

- Ingredients:
- 4 skinless chicken drumsticks
- 1/4 cup apricot nectar
- 1 tablespoon low salt soy sauce
- 2 teaspoons tomato sauce

Method:

- 1.Make a few slashes in each drumstick using a sharp knife.
- 2.Put drumsticks in an ovenproof dish.
- 3. Pour over the combined nectar, sauces and lemon iuice.
- 4. Marinate for 30 minutes.
- 5. Preheat oven to 180 degrees and bake with marinade for 30 minutes turning once.
- Can be served hot or packed cold in a school




### Catering
