



BLOOD BLITZ IN GOULBURN THIS SCHOOL HOLIDAYS

Goulburn needs more than 160 donors to give blood this Christmas and New Year to secure blood stocks for cancer patients over the festive season.

The Australian Red Cross Blood Service is concerned that most residents will take an extended holiday this festive season leading to a major drop-off in platelets, the shortest-lived blood product that is critical in the treatment of cancer patients.

Platelets were vital to the treatment of cancer patients but only had a shelf life of five days.

The Goulburn Blood Bank needs donors all year round, but particularly between 20 December and 3 January- the time when donations could hit a critical low and then to cover the donors that leave town over January.

We know Christmas is an important time for Goulburn residents to spend with family and friends, but spare a thought for the many Australians who have a loved one in hospital and in need of blood, with the hope of spending another Christmas together.
