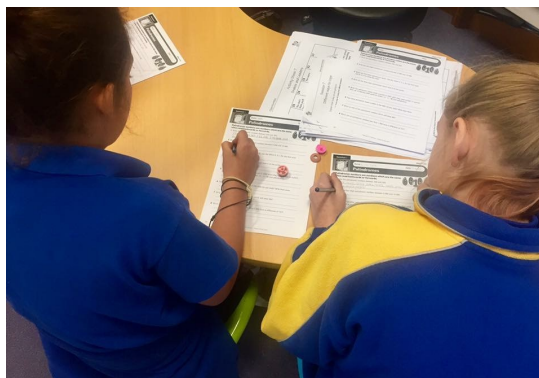


NSW Grandparents Day celebrates the contributions grandparents and older people make to their families and communities.

The staff have been doing work on Number sense. It essentially refers to a student's "fluidity and flexibility with numbers. Children have a sense of what numbers mean, they understand their relationship to one another, and are able to perform mental math, understand symbolic representations, and can use those numbers in real world situations.



5L participate in Circuit activities each week with their buddy class K-2M. Members of each of the ten groups work on improving their personal best fitness repetitions and give encouragement to their team mates. Earth and Space is the topic of Term 4's science program. This week we have calculated our body mass on each planet of the Solar System and the Moon. We understand that the more gravity a planet has, the heavier we weigh. In Literacy Groups, we choose a news story from the Herald Kids website each week, read it and complete a follow up activity. We are enjoying our last term together in Year 5.



Participation in gymnastics helps meet the exercise recommendations set forth by the American Heart Association. The American Heart Association recommends children participate in 60 minutes of physical activity per day. Adults age 18 and over should participate in 30 minutes of exercise at least five days per week. Activities should be moderately intense meaning exercise should cause the participant to break a sweat and elevate their heart rate. Gymnastics is considered moderately intense physical activity.

Selective High School Application for Year 7 entry 2019

Some primary schools across NSW offer places in 'opportunity classes' for gifted and talented students in Years 5 and 6. To be considered for placement students must sit the Opportunity Class Placement Test. For information about applying and the placement process go to <https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-5>.

Selective high schools cater for the specific needs of high achieving gifted students who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic and social level. Selective schools help gifted and talent students to learn by grouping them with other gifted and talented students, teaching them in specialised ways and providing educational materials at the appropriate level. Parents apply when the student is in Year 5. The students sit the test in March of Year 6.

To be considered for placement students must sit the Selective High School Placement Test. For information about applying and the placement process go to <https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-7>.
