



In 5/6B we have been investigating patterns and algebra and how it relates to real world situations. We used paddle-pop sticks and blu tac to create geometric constructions of bird houses you might find at a poultry show. We reflected on the number pattern and how we could use this information to make mathematical predictions that would help to organise the housing of the chickens at the 'show'. Through this activity we were able to bring some of the real world into our Maths while learning about different number patterns and their functions.
